Brisbane writer pens novel riding CityCat ferry

Brisbane-based novelist Guy Lane has recently completed a sustainable adventure novel – The Moogh – written exclusively while travelling on the CityCat ferries on the Brisbane River.

Lane (48) is a professional sustainability advisor, QUT Masters Student and Director of environmental charity, The Long Future Foundation.

The Moogh is his fifth fiction novel, all of which have sustainability themes.

In the story the Moogh is an 11-foot high primate that wandered out of a forest one day and quickly gained a huge cult-like following as a messenger of world peace and sustainability.

The Moogh was written between March and September this year.

“All of the writing and editing was undertaken on the CityCat as I travelled between home in Bulimba and QUT University although sometimes I just rode back and forth on the weekends,” said Lane.

The Moogh story is told through Maggie Tarp, an aspiring young journalist who learns of the corruption and deceit the organization tasked by the United Nations with managing the Moogh.

“I get a lot of inspiration being around the water and all the hustle and bustle of an efficient and popular public transport system is inspirational me,” Lane said.
